



## Arts Grants Awarded in Hubbard County

**Region 2 Arts Council (R2AC) awarded \$53,146 to arts organizations, schools, non-profits, and individual artists in Hubbard County in FY2016.**

A \$6,000 Arts & Cultural Heritage Grant was awarded to Nemeth Art Center to assist in funding "Take A Walk on the Wild Side," a Wild Rice Festival hosted in partnership with the White Earth Nation, to celebrate the natural wild rice of this region and showcase regional artwork and musical performances.

A \$6,000 Arts & Cultural Heritage Grant was awarded to Northern Light Opera Company to assist in funding a theater performance of an updated edition of the musical "Annie Get Your Gun" in Park Rapids.

A \$6,000 Community Arts Support Grant was awarded to Northern Light Opera Company to provide general operating support.

A \$5,500 Arts & Cultural Heritage Grant was awarded to Nemeth Art Center to assist in funding the "Halloween Happening," a community, concert, dance, and interactive theater experience.

A \$4,780 Arts & Cultural Heritage Grant was awarded to Park Rapids Lakes Area Arts Council to assist in funding the "Art Leap 2016" a driving tour of artists' studios and concert venues with live music.

A \$4,000 Community Arts Support Grant was awarded to Heartland Concert Association to provide general operating support.

A \$3,000 Community Arts Support Grant was awarded to Park Rapids Lakes Area Arts Council to provide general operating support.

A \$2,500 Arts Project Grant was awarded to Park Rapids Lakes Area Arts Council to assist in funding the "Great American Story" competition and performance event.

A \$2,455 Arts Project Grant was awarded to Nemeth Art Center to assist in funding an exhibition of Kate Casanova's sculptures and Cameron Gainer's photographs and films.

A \$2,411 Arts Project Grant was awarded to Nemeth Art Center to assist in funding an exhibition of Jim Denomie's paintings & John Salhuss' drawings, paintings and installations.

A \$500 Quick Grant was awarded to Nemeth Art Center to assist in funding their executive director's attendance in the Midwest Art Conservation Center's workshop, "Writing Grants for Preservation and Conservation Projects."

Therese Lumbar of Park Rapids was awarded a \$1,000 Anishinaabe Arts Initiative Grant to purchase materials and supplies to improve her home workspace to create star quilts.

Mark Bridge of Park Rapids was awarded a \$500 Quick Grant for Individuals to purchase equipment to enhance his interactive presentation of popular songs from the American Victorian period with the addition of a power point presentation and projector.

Lou Ann Muhm of Park Rapids was awarded a \$2,000 Individual Artist Grant to assist in funding a month-long writing residency at the Vermont Studio Center, one of the country's largest artists' colony.
